Program of Studies

Covington Catholic High School is a college preparatory school for young men. An intensive curriculum includes a four-year program in English, science, Spanish or Latin, a five-year sequence in mathematics, and a four-year social studies offering. The HSPT placement exam is given to prospective freshman students, and a limited number of scholarships are awarded based on the results of the testing.

The curriculum consists of five levels: Advanced Placement, Honors, Dual Credit, College Prep I, and College Prep II.

Classes meet 5 days a week, 7 periods per day.

Weighting System

In calculating the grade on a 4.0 scale, the grade point average a student receives for an honors course will receive an additional 0.5 after the GPA value is assigned, and an additional 1.0 for AP and Dual Credit courses after the GPA value is assigned. GPA will be calculated and rounded to two decimal points.

Student Recognition: Beginning with the Class of 2021, using a weighted grade point average, seniors can now be recognized at the conclusion of their senior year as:
