ATHLETICS

- 13 KHSAA-sanctioned + 5 club/intramural sports
- Approximately 66% of students participate on one or more teams
- At least one "no-cut" sport each season

ARCHERY

Archery is a KHSAA winter sport. The program, established seven years ago, is strong in numbers and results.

BASEBALL

The baseball program includes Freshman, JV and Varsity teams. The Varsity has delivered 34 consecutive 20-win seasons.

BASKETBALL

The Colonel Basketball Program, with Freshman, JV and Varsity teams, is consistently top rated in the state, and competes in tournaments in several other states.

BASS FISHING

The newest KHSAA sport in the CovCath lineup, the Bass Fishing team has fished on Lake Cumberland and Kentucky Lake, with one team placing at the state tournament in 2019.

BOWLING

A team of 8-12 bowlers competes against other area school teams in the NKHS Bowling League during the winter.

CROSS COUNTRY

Open to any student dedicated to team and individual improvement for long distance running. They have daily practice and 1-2 meets per week (Mid-July to November).

FOOTBALL

The Football Program, with Freshman, JV, and Varsity teams is consistently top ranked, with a long tradition of prominence. As many as 100 student-athletes are involved year-round, but may compete in other seasons' sports.

GOLF

Approximately 20 players compete at JV and Varsity levels on great courses against top teams from across the state. Tryouts in July; season runs August through October.

SOCCER

Almost 70 players play on the Freshman, JV, and Varsity teams, with no cuts at the Freshman level. Tryouts are in July and the season runs from August through October.

SWIM & DIVE

Open to all students, the AquaColonels practice with 4 water workouts and 2 dry land workouts per week and 2 dive practices per week for divers.

TENNIS

The Yung Family Tennis Complex is home to the JV and Varsity Colonel tennis teams who complete in the spring season with teams from across the region. Coaches are dedicated to the athletes having a positive experience.

TRACK & FIELD

Students compete at the Freshman, JV, and Varsity levels at meets throughout the region in the spring.

WRESTLING

Any student not involved in another fall/winter team sport is eligible to join the JV or Varsity wrestling teams.

LACROSSE (Club Status)

This club sport has JV and Varsity teams that compete across the region and in a state tournament in the spring.



INTRAMURALS

- Open to all students, of all skill levels
- Friendly but vigorous competition between grades

BASKETBALL (IBL)

More than half the student body participates each year in grade-level leagues. These are student run and officiated.

BOWLING

Students of all skill levels bowl one day per week after school.

FRISBEE GOLF

Join Coach Kleier and Father Hennigen for frisbee golf once a week at a local frisbee golf course.

WIFFLEBALL

Multiple tournaments are held each year. Anyone can participate, and players choose their own teams.

House System

schools, the House System provides a structure to help each student find his place as a member of one of six "Column" groups, as well as one of the smaller, multi-grade and bonded "mentor groups" within the Columns. Group members get to know each other (and the Mentor Teacher) well when they discuss current events, play games or have competitions! The main goals are interaction, camaraderie and support. Each Column earns points by member participation in "Marquee" events. One of the most noteworthy Colonel traditions, the Braveheart March, reflects the House System as marchers paint themselves in blue war paint and carry the Column crests. The "Colonel Classic" is a school-wide Column competition involving skills like Colonel cheers, pie-eating, wheelbarrow races, and tug of war. The Colonel House System benefits from strong student leadership, provided by multiple elected positions in each Column and Mentor Group. These leaders are responsible for motivating and role modeling for their group's members, and serving as liaisons to school administration.
