PROGRAM OF STUDIES

Covington Catholic High School is a college preparatory school for young men. An intensive curriculum includes a four-year program in English, science, German or Spanish, a five-year sequence in mathematics, and a four-year social studies offering. The HSPT placement exam is given to prospective freshman students and a limited number of scholarships are awarded based on the results of the testing.

The curriculum consists of four levels: Advanced Placement, Honors, College Prep I, and College Prep II/III. Classes meet 5 days a week, 7 periods per day.
